ORDER:

The Government is committed to implement the Primary Health care system. The Primary Health Centres which play a pivotal role in rendering medical facilities to the rural areas are being established on a phased programme depending upon the State's financial position. The Government of India have fixed the target of establishing Primary Health Centres in Tamil Nadu for the 7th plan period as 1057. At the beginning, Primary Health Centres were opened at the rate of one Primary Health Centre per block covering a population of more than one lakh. In order to provide proper medical facilities to the rural people in the remote area of the Primary Health Centres, Mobile Health Teams were started providing outreach services to the people. 274 Mobile Health Teams are currently functioning in the State. In pursuance of the "Alma Atta" Declaration to provide health to all by 2000 AD, it has been decided to strengthen the Primary Health Care network and establish one Primary Health Centre for every 30,000 population in the plain and one Health Sub-centre for every 5000 population.

The Director of Primary Health Centres has been requested to review whether the existing Mobile Health Teams may be reorganised opening instead additional Primary Health Centres. It has been considered essential to convert the Mobile Health Teams into additional Primary Health Centres, sanctioning the required additional facilities including extra man power to establish the new grid of one Primary Health Centre for every 30000 population serving the public better. Accordingly, the Director of Primary Health Centres has submitted proposals to convert the existing 274 Mobile Health Teams into additional Primary Health Centres. ~~XXXX~~

2. The Director of Primary Health Centres has stated that the staff pattern for each Mobile Health Unit after conversion as additional Primary Health Centres and the number of posts required would be as follows;-

As per the revised pattern, each Primary Health Centre will have two medical officers. There are 383 Primary Health Centres having a third Medical Officer of whom 274 Medical Officers are attached to Mobile Health Teams. Each Mobile Health Team is staffed with one Medical Officer, Two Pharmacists and one Driver. There are 112 vehicles with drivers attached to Mobile Health Teams and there are Primary Health Centres having a second vehicle with drivers of which 162 vehicles with drivers can be diverted to Mobile Health Teams after conversion into additional Primary Health Centres. The number of Pharmacists available is 523 which will be in excess of the required number of 274. After the re-allocation of the existing staff and development of the second vehicle attached to some of the Primary Health Centres, the requirement of staff for converting the 274 Mobile Health Teams will be as below;

3. The Government have carefully examined the proposal in para 2 above. They accordingly direct that

- i) the existing 274 Mobile Health Teams attached to Primary Health Centres be converted into additional Primary Health Centres with the staff mentioned in the Annexure I to this order.

- ii) sanction be accorded for the creation of posts mentioned in the Annexure II of this order on the scales of pay noted against each. The extra posts of 165 Medical Officers will be filled up with effect from 1.10.88.
- iii) the existing 112  $\times$  vehicles with drivers attached to the Mobile Health Teams be diverted to the converted additional Primary Health Centres.
- iv) Out of the second vehicles available with the existing Primary Health Centres, 162 vehicles with drivers be re-deployed in the converted additional Primary Health Centres;
- v) from the existing 523 posts of Pharmacists available with the Mobile Medical Teams, 274 Posts be absorbed in the converted Primary Health Centres and 140 posts be absorbed in the 140 additional Primary Health Centres newly sanctioned in G.O.Ms.No.1356, Health dt.15.7.87. The remaining posts be absorbed in the new additional Primary Health Centres to be established in future.
- vi) sanction be accorded to incur a recurring expenditure of Rs.232.16 lakhs (Rs.two hundred and thirty two lakhs and sixteen thousand only) and a non-recurring expenditure of Rs.76.72 lakhs (Rs.seventy six lakhs and seventy two thousand only) as detailed in Annexure III to this order.

- vii) The existing provision of Rs.20000/- for drugs/medicines for each Mobile Primary Health Centre will be made available to the newly formed additional Primary Health Centres.

4. The expenditure should be debited to "2210 Medical and Public Health-03-Rural Health Services- Allocated-103. Primary Health Centres-Schemes in the VII Five Year Plan-II-State Plan-JM.Primary Health Centres" (D.F.Code No 2210-03-103-II.JM.0008)

5. The Director of Primary Health Centres is requested to send necessary proposals for inclusion of expenditure in the Revised Estimate 1988-89 and Final Modified Appropriation 1988-89.
