PRIMARY HEALTH CENTRES - Establishment of 50 New Primary Health Centres in Tamil Nadu during 1990-91 - Orders Issued.

ORDER:

The Government places the greatest emphasis on "health for all" and has adopted the Primary Health care approach. It is the long term policy of the Government to establish one Primary Health Centre for every 20,000 population in the rural areas.

2. The Director of Primary Health Centres has submitted proposals for opening of 100 new Primary Health Centres in the state during 1990-91. After careful examination, the Government have decided to sanction the establishment of 50 new Primary Health Centres with the staff mentioned in the Annexure I to this order, for each Primary Health Centre.

3. They accordingly pass the following orders:-

- (a) Sanction is accorded for establishment of 50 new Primary Health Centres in the state during 1990-91;
- (b) Sanction is also accorded for the creation of posts for each of the 50 Primary Health Centres as per pattern as mentioned in the Annexure-I to this order;
- (c) The recurring and non-recurring expenditure is sanctioned for the 50 Primary Health Centres as sanctioned in the Annexure-II to this order;
- (d) The break up details for the expenditure towards non-salaried items such as office expenses, medicines etc to each Primary Health Centre are mentioned in the Annexure III to this order.

4. Sanction is also accorded for the supply of one Tamil Typewriter (Policy Size) to each of the 50 Primary Health Centres by the Director of Stationery and Printing, Madras, free of cost.

5. The Director of Primary Health Centres is requested to send immediately proposals to Government to locate the 50 Primary Health Centres with location maps and relevant details.

6. The Director of Primary Health Centres is also requested to send necessary proposals separately with plans and estimates for the construction of buildings for the 50 Primary Health Centres sanctioned in para 4(a) above. Meanwhile necessary arrangements should be made to make Primary Health Centres function in rented buildings wherever rent free buildings or Government buildings are not available.

7. The Director of Primary Health Centres is also requested to send separate proposals for sanction of vehicle with Driver, if necessary.

8. The Director of Primary Health Centres is requested to issue instructions to the Medical Officer concerned to appoint Sanitary Worker on consolidated pay of Rs.125/- per mensem.

9. The Director of Primary Health Centres is requested to include the additional expenditure incurred over and above the budget provision in Revised Estimate/Final Modified Appropriation for 1950-51.

10. The expenditure should be debited to "2210. Medical and Public Health - 03. Rural Health Services - Allopathy - 103. Primary Health Centres - Schemes in the Eighth Five Year Plan - II. State Plan - Jm. Primary Health Centres" (D.P. Code No. 2210-03-103-Jm 0000).

11. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department - Vide its U.O.No.5654/FS/P/50, dated 31.10.50.
