

PENSION - Qualifying service for pension - Reduction in the maximum qualifying service for full pension - Orders - Issued.

READ - the following:-

ORDER:-

As per rule 43 (2-A) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978, as amended in the Government Order read above Government servants should have rendered not less than thirty three years of qualifying service for getting full pension and the pension shall be calculated at the rate of 50 percent of average emoluments. In the case of Government servants retiring before completing qualifying service of thirty three years, but after completing qualifying service of ten years, the amount of pension shall be computed proportionately with reference to the actual qualifying service rendered by them. As per rule 31 of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978, average of the pay drawn by the Government servants during the last ten months at the time of their retirement shall be taken into account for the purpose of calculation of pension.

2. Consequent on the raising of the age limit for entry into Government service to 28 years, a Government employee entering service at the age of 28 years will not qualify for full pension after retirement at the age of 58. The Government have considered the representations of the Associations of Government employees to enable those entering service at the age of 28 years to get full pension after completing 30 years of qualifying service and decided to reduce the qualifying service from 33 years to 30 years to get full pension. The Government have also decided to make certain changes in the methodology for calculation of pension.

3. Accordingly, the Government direct that the maximum qualifying service be reduced from 33 years to 30 years to become eligible for full pension by the Government servants after retirement. The Government also direct that pension shall be determined based on the 50% of average emoluments drawn during the last 10 months of service rendered or 50% of pay last drawn by the Government servants, whichever is higher.

4. These orders shall be applicable in the cases of Government servants retiring on or after 1.7.96.

5. Necessary amendments to the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules 1978 will be issued separately.
