ORDER :

The National Programme for Control of Blindness is 100% centrally sponsored scheme. The Government of India allocated total grant of Rs.31.09 lakhs to this State during the year 1985-86 for implementation of the Scheme. Of which a grant of Rs.4.50 lakhs (Rs.1.50 lakhs Non-recurring + 3.00 lakhs Recurring) has been sanctioned for creation of 20 posts of Ophthalmic Assistants in 20 Primary Health Centres and procurement of equipments to the above Primary Health Centres.

2. The Government of India have also informed that they have no objection for the State Government to utilise Rs.5.70 lakhs for the creation of 20 posts of Ophthalmic Assistants during the financial year 1991-92 (which was originally sanctioned during 1985-86).

3. The proposals were received from the erst-while Director of Primary Health Centres in this regard. The Government after careful examination of the proposal have decided to accept the above proposal. Accordingly, sanction is accorded for creation of 20 posts of Ophthalmic Assistants in the scale of pay of Rs.1350-30-1440-40-1800-50-2200 at the

one post in each of 20 (twenty) Primary Health Centres. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is requested to identify 20 Primary Health Centres and send necessary proposals for approval.

4. Sanction is also accorded to incur an expenditure of Rs.5000/- (Rupees Five thousand only) for procurement of equipments to the above 20 Primary Health Centres, out of which each Primary Health Centres will be getting items of equipments worth Rs.3000/- direct from the Government of India towards their share as indicated in annexure to this order.

5. The Director of Medical Education is requested to start a Conscious Retraining Programme so that future proposal for Ophthalmic Assistants maynot pose any financial burden to the State Government.

6. The expenditure shall be debited to the Head of Account " 2210. Medical and Public Health - 06. Public Health - 101. Prevention and Control of Diseases - Schemes in the VIII Five Year Plan - III - Centrally Sponsored - SD -- Prevention and Control of Diseases ( DPC 2210 06 101 SD 0106).
