

Public Health and Preventive Medicine Department - Primary Health Centres - Establishment of Six new Primary Health Centres under Part II scheme for 1998-99 - Orders Issued.

ORDER:-

With a view to provide preventive and curative Health Care and Family Welfare Services to the people in rural areas, Primary Health Centres are established, as per norms of Government of India according to which one Primary Health Centre has to be established for every 30,000 population in the plain areas and for every 20,000 population in hilly areas. As on 31.3.1998, 1408 Primary Health Centres including 63 community Health Centres are functioning in Tamil Nadu.

2. The Primary Health Centres are not evenly distributed in all the blocks as per these norms. There are eight (8) blocks which have only one Primary Health Centre each and forty seven blocks which have two Primary Health Centres each. Thus in 55 blocks, 66 additional Primary Health Centres have to be established to meet the needs of the population at block level. It has been proposed to establish the Primary Health Centres in a phased manner and under part II scheme for 1998-99, it is proposed to establish six (6) Primary Health Centres in the first phase.

3. Accordingly, the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has submitted proposals for opening of six Primary Health Centres in Tamil Nadu under part II scheme for 1998-99 at a total cost of Rs 53.40 lakhs.

4. After careful examination, the Government accept the proposal of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, and accord sanction for the establishment of six new primary health centres in the following places in Tamil Nadu under part II scheme for 1998-99.

5. The Government also accord sanction for the creation of posts for each of the PHC as per the pattern mentioned in Annexure-I to this order.

6. Sanction is also accorded to incur an expenditure of Rs.53.40 lakhs (Rupees fifty three lakhs and forty thousand only) which includes a sum of Rs.26.40 (Rupees twenty six lakhs and forty thousand only) as recurring expenditure and a sum of Rs. 27.00 lakhs (Rupees twenty seven lakh only) as non-recurring expenditure as detailed in Annexure II to this order.

7. The Government direct the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine to make necessary arrangements for the establishments of six new PHC mentioned above immediately.

8. The expenditure should be debited to "2210 - Medical and Public Health - 03 - Rural Health Services - Allopathy - 103 - Primary Health Centres - Schemes in the ninth five year Plan II - State plan JM Primary Health Centres" (DPC No.2210 - 03 - 103 JM 0008).
